




Interdisciplinary learning in MyP

What is Interdisciplinary

In the MYP, interdisciplinary learning supports students to understand bodies of knowledge from two or more disciplines or subject groups, in order to integrate them and create new understanding







In each year of the programme (Year 7 to 10), students are engaged in at least one collaboratively planned interdisciplinary unit that involves at least two subject groups. In the last year of MYP (Year 11) the eAssessment is designed to evaluate students' understanding and application of concepts across different subject areas through the use of multimedia resources, particularly digital media such as videos, animations, and interactive simulations. In this assessment students demonstrate their ability to integrate knowledge and skills from various disciplines to analyze complex problems, explore real-world issues, and propose innovative solutions.

Assessing Interdisciplinary learning

Three criteria are assessed

Evaluating Students will evaluate how more than one discipline contributes to the interdisciplinary understanding of real-world issues and ideas.

Synthesizing Students will integrate knowledge from more than one discipline in ways that inform inquiry into real world issues and ideas in order to explain phenomena or create a product.

Reflecting Students will reflect on the development of their interdisciplinary understanding of real-world issues and ideas
