

Lower Primary : Gr 3/ Yr 4: A photograph must be taken with a minimum resolution of 300 DPI. Upper Primary : Gr 4 - 5/ Yr 5 - 6: A photograph must be taken with a minimum resolution of 300 DPI. Middle School : Gr 6 - 9/ Yr 7 - 10: A photograph must be taken with a minimum resolution of 300 DPI. High School : Gr 10 - 12/ Yr 11 - 13: A photograph must be taken with a minimum resolution of 300 DPI.

A maximum of 5 submissions will be accepted per year group; a total of 20 entries must be submitted from this category. All photographs must be submitted in JPEG format.

Installation – Each year group must follow one of the suggested themes as per the age range. The installation could be an immersive, multi-sensory piece that visually represents Innoventures Education's collective journey over the past twenty years. It would be a timeline-inspired walk-through that celebrates growth, milestones, and student stories, engaging viewers with a blend of art, technology, and interaction. **Timeline Pathway**: This winding pathway leads visitors through significant moments from Innoventures Education's history. Memory Tree: A large Memory Tree[®] made of metal, wood, and fabric symbolizes Innoventuses Induced that reflects their personal experiences.

Interactive Digital Display : The installation could incorporate technology and include an interactive digital display that allows visitors to scroll through key achievements, student projects, and memories.

Each school can submit 2 group art projects, one fr from secondary school. The projects must reflect 6 themes. The original artwork must be submit Department with the artwork title, concept, and in to showcase the artwork). Students may use any they wish to use. The Art teacher may select the size will be used for the installation from A4, A3, and A paper, fabric, canvas, or any other material.
